An autobiographical comment:

To describe area resident Neil Clemons as a NEW artist would be a mistake. More apt would be "revived" artist as in "recently revived after a 35-year hiatus."

He's no new kid on the block. On the other hand, he's no Grandpa Moses either. Who he is might be boiled down to this: A balding elder photographer and poet who turns digital images into what he fancies to be art. His current preference is creating what looks to be paintings from "standard" photographs.

He put his journey into photographic art on hold three decades ago when he converted his darkroom into a bedroom and settled for having prints and slides commercially made. After satisfying careers in journalism, public relations, and as a family counselor, when he hit his 60s he began taking time to seriously indulge the arts—writing poetry and teaching himself the art and craft of digital photography.

Eclectic from his childhood in Whitman County, Neil's photography reflects a wide range of interest and style—ranging from traditional portraits and local landscapes to abstract computer-manipulated images. However, his favorite subjects are what he sees in nature, particularly as he experiences life in Pend Oreille County.

He carries his Canon camera with him almost every day as he gardens and hikes from his Calispel Trail cabin, and as he and wife canoe, ski, cycle, and explore around the world. He lets his imagination roam, capturing whatever the light and view of the moment suggest might be fun to "play with" later on his computer.

The challenge for Neil is to turn an ordinary or average image into something that awakens memories and arouses the senses. Best, he says, is when his photographs reach into viewers' lives with a spark of power and beauty. Then he has the deeper satisfaction of knowing that the pleasures and messages of the visual arts are embraced and expanded into the community. His aim, with both words and photographs, is to contribute to the mysterious nurture of kinder, gentler, and happier souls.

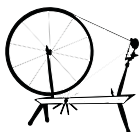
