

Featured Artist: Chrisinda Bowlin



Chrisinda Bowlin has taught Pysanky Egg classes for CREATE for several years, and she will teach another class on August 4.

Chrisinda says, "I first learned the Pysanky art form twelve years ago in a high school art class. It's a form of Batik on an egg. Pysanky is a many-stepped process of dyeing and waxing. Finally, the beeswax is melted off to reveal the design underneath. I have used all kinds of eggs, from dove to ostrich and even exotics such as peahen, swan and crocodile. My favorite is duck for its strength and smoothness. I love blending the traditional Ukrainian elements, which I first used when learning this process, with non-traditional elements. Most of my eggs have an art nouveau touch to them. When I start a design I usually have a very basic idea of what I want, but I let the egg decide what it's going to be. Sometimes I have to let it sit for a week until it speaks to me. Almost all the eggs I use are from my own birds. I give the birds extra calcium to ensure shell quality.

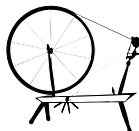
